For what purpose or project is the grant requested? (please continue on a separate sheet if necessary)	<p>The Grant is requested to enable the school to put solar panels on the roof. This request serves two purposes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To save the school money on energy bills going forward, enabling them to continue to provide the best education for children. The proposal is expected to save £4,231 per year as an initial estimate. This money can then be directly reinvested in children and facilities.2. To enable the school to reduce its carbon footprint. There is currently a CIF bid in via the DFE to replace the old failing boilers with a heat pump. If this bid is successful, the school will be able to run as a NET Zero carbon school for scope 1 and 2 emissions. Current expected carbon savings from the solar alone would be 5,100 kg per year. <p>The school is already a green flag school, and the children are passionate about saving the planet. This would provide an educational opportunity as well as allow the school to shine as a leader in this area.</p>
