


Below is a map showing the locations where speed surveys were carried out

Dear Cllr Broadbent

Longwick Transport Vision & Longwick Neighbourhood Plan First Phase Projects - Proposed Local Speed Limit Changes

Following our meeting on 6th July last year, we are pleased to be able to share the new traffic speed data that you recommended we collect, in order to support our proposals for lower speed limits in Longwick Parish.

We commissioned TfB to collect the data, and Simon Vale has sent us both the raw data and an analysis for each location. We attach an excel spreadsheet which provides a summary of the key data, as well as the percentage of HGVs. We have updated our report to include this speed data and attach an updated copy of it here.

Having reviewed the speed data, we conclude that the average speeds at each location indicate lower speed limits as being appropriate and are likely to be seen as such by all road users. We hope that this, plus the detailed justifications set out in our report, will be viewed favourably by Buckinghamshire Council.

We would also like to reiterate the risk to horse riders using roads in Longwick Parish, as we described last year, and a recent article in the *Bucks Free Press* (6 Jan 2023) reported that Buckinghamshire has a high rate of horse fatalities on the Council's roads. Our report quantifies the number of horses and stables in Longwick Parish, and we believe the proposals for lower speed limits will positively contribute towards reducing this risk.

We are able to commit funding from Longwick Parish Council's CIL allocation to implement lower speed limits and associated traffic calming measures. However, we appreciate that Buckinghamshire Council will need to assess our proposals first. Our report sets out for officers why we believe our proposals meet the various considerations and criteria set out in the Government guidance on setting local speed limits.

We would be pleased to hear how this matter can now be taken forward and would be happy to meet your officers at an early stage to discuss the proposals and provide a local perspective.
